And for all those I didn't name but hold dearly in our heart. We cry out with grief and lament for healing and repair. We pray for mental health resources and support for all who were impacted, and for leaders to take action against the easy availability of deadly automatic weapons. We pray for all school students, educators, staff, and families who are returning to school in this season. God, keep them safe. God, keep them safe!

For all preparing for hurricane season and repairing from natural disasters, including floods, drought, wildfires, smoke and extreme heat. For governments and leaders to prioritize climate change solutions above profit and greed.

We pray with deep sighs for the war and death and violence in the Holy Land. 

September Council Meeting Minutes

The St. Olaf Lutheran Church council met on September 2, 2025.

Present: David Oehlke, Colette Boehmer, Arne Berg, Kristi Trottier, Louise Oleson, Anne Rasmusson, Michael Kitsch, Pastor Lori Pankratz, Darci Gilbertson. Absent: Evan Markestad

President Dave Oehlke called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm. Pastor Lori presented a devotion from Genesis 1: 26-31, highlighting God's call to mankind regarding stewardship. God granted humankind authority or dominion over the fish, birds, and every living creature, a role that involves responsible stewardship of the earth. Pastor Lori led us in prayer.

The minutes of the August 2025 council meeting were reviewed. Thank you to Anne for preparing the minutes. Kristi moved to accept the minutes. Arne seconded. The minutes were approved.

Arne presented the Treasurer's report. Approximate balances as of August 31, 2025. General fund: \$1900.00; Designated funds: \$73,000.00.

Money has been borrowed from the Contingency fund over the summer to meet payroll.

Pastor Lori's report was reviewed. She presided over 2 funerals and 2 baptisms. She highlighted upcoming events - Rally Sunday, WELCA fall conference, WELCA rummage sale, and Dakotah Oyate Christmas gift bags.

Christian Education and Youth & Family Ministry: Kristi and Anne reported that Rally Sunday will be on September 7. Kristi has created new registration forms for Sunday school participants. All Sunday School teachers are in place, and the Spark curriculum will be used.

Church Properties, Life in Ministry & Mission - No reports.

Stewardship: Michael reported that Jeri Steffan completed a count of St. Olaf members for the purpose of amending the constitution regarding quorum for the annual meeting. Based on Jeri's count the council is proposing a change from a quorum of 75 to a quorum of 10% of current membership which is approximately 420 members. Two congregational meetings are needed to make a change to the constitution. The first meeting will be on Sunday, Sept. 7 to introduce the proposal and the second meeting is scheduled for Octo-

ber 12, 2025, to vote on the proposed amendment to the constitution.

Worship & Music: Pastor Lori reported that she will use a Dr. Suess liturgy for Rally Sunday as the theme for Sunday school is "Oh, the places you'll go!" (with God).


