FAITH MATTERS;

ἀγάπη (agapē) – "Love" (John 14: vv. 15, 21, 23–24) "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them." This is not romantic love, nor is it mere affection. Agapē is covenantal, self-giving, and one-directional. Jesus does not say, "If you obey me, then you can prove your love." He says, "If you love me, you will keep my word"—not as a condition, but as a natural outflow of being loved first. Love begets love. And what is "his word"? It is the Word that brings life, that raises the dead, that forgives sinners. This love is not *our* achievement—it is our participation in the eternal love of the Father and the Son, now shared with us by the Spirit. This trinity of Love that changes everything.

This is the language of communion, not transaction. To Love like this is not to perform but to remain—to rest in the relationship established by God. Jesus abides in the Father, and promises that the Spirit will abide in us. But not only that—we are told that the Father and the Son will come and make their home with those who love him. This is the radical reversal of religion: God doesn't wait for us to find him. God moves in. The Trinity takes up residence in the heart of the believer—not through moral perfection, but through the Word received in faith.

What is WELCA?

WELCA stands for **W**omen of the **E**vangelical **L**utheran **C**hurch in **A**merica.

The WELCA mission statement is as follows:

"As a community of women, created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world."

St. Olaf WELCA is comprised of all the women of St. Olaf. It includes the 4 circles we have been discussing in past Spire issues- Anna, Deborah, Miriam, and Prisca.

St. Olaf WELCA meets nine times per year. Seven Thursdays @1:30p.m. and two Sundays after service. Times are announced in

the Spire calendar and Sunday bulletin.

The meeting consists of a Bible study lead by Pastor Lori. The Bible study is followed by a business meeting. This is where events such as the rummage sales, bazaar, donut and lefse making dates, benevolences or any other topic a member brings forth are decided. Following that there is a coffee fellowship served by the ladies of one of the circles.

In addition to the various mission kits gathered by the circles, WELCA donates money to SAAF, Salvation Army, Great Plains Food Bank, Bingo prizes at the care center, Red Willow Bible Camp, Lutheran Campus Ministries, Nexus Family Heal-

ing (was Luther Hall), Hope Center, LR Community Shelter, Central Africa Republic, St Olaf Contingency Fund, and other designated St. Olaf funds such as: windows, organ, library, radio, pastor's emergency, scholarship, 3rd & 7th grade bibles, baptismal items, and youth fund. WELCA also pays for Christ in our Home devotionals and various other needed items that may occur. WELCA has a decorating fund and quilting fund.

Being involved in the work WELCA does is a good way to get to know other St Olaf ladies and accomplish much needed objectives and missions. If there is something you would like to see addressed or another form of outreach WELCA may be a place to start.

What is the reason we fill out the blue form for communion?

The Blue sheet provides information for the church office staff that is reviewed on Monday mornings. First, it gives us attendance and membership information that is needed by the ELCA. Since membership is in part determined by our records of those communing, vour acknowledgement of receiving communion is important. Second, we also need our member's contact information so we can alert them of our church activities through up-to-date telephone numbers and email addresses. That information in turn allows us to keep our records accurate. Finally, the Blue Sheet tells us when members or visitors want a pastoral visit, are interested in church membership, have questions, and have prayer requests.
